Thank you to those who purchased items at the Book Fair. We had a very nice selection of books and gift items...which led to a very successful sale.

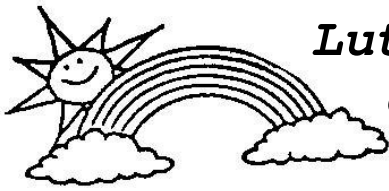

## Happy New Year 2012!

We hope you had a blessed Christmas.

Are your children becoming restless and the new Christmas toy no longer is entertaining your child. As adults, we enjoy a variety of activities and children will also benefit from planned activities.

**Stagger your child's day with physical activity, fine motor activities, listening and moving to music, reading a book, singing songs, and some television time.**

- **Physical Activity Ideas**

Do the Chicken Dance, the Hokey Pokey, or Musical Chairs. Put on jazzy rhythmic music and use an empty oatmeal box that becomes a drum, clap your hands, march upstairs or downstairs. Pick one of your favorite soft toys and play hide and seek with it.

- **Set up a Toy Store**

Use toys from your toy box. Help your child categorize them. A shelf or a cardboard box turned upside down will work. Create a spot for the soft toys, the vehicles, the dolls, the doll clothes, and the blocks. Allow your child to use a toy shopping cart or a basket and some monopoly money. Have a playmate or sibling become the clerk.

- **Set up a Restaurant or a Grocery Store**

For a grocery store, save the empty pudding, jello, cracker, Kleenex, bandaid, cereal, or various other small boxes. Tape them shut, attach a price tag and open your store.

- **The Line Up Game**

Have fun lining up all the cars and trucks by size. Other variations are to use stuffed animals, dolls, Princess dolls, and action figures.

- **Have a Tea Party**

Use your child's plastic tea set or even some of your "safe" dishes. Plan what you are going to serve. Is it time to bake up some cookies or use up the leftover Christmas cookies? Invite a friend over for a play date with your child. (Oh don't forget, Grandma's LOVE tea parties.

- **Make homemade playdough**

Allow your child to use those Christmas cookie cutters and the spatulas. Our favorite cooked playdough we used for holiday decorations was: Heat 2 cups water in a large kettle on the stove. Stir in 1 cup salt, 2 tablespoons of powdered alum, 1/3 cup vegetable oil, and several drops of your favorite color of food coloring. When hot, remove from heat and stir in 1 1/2 cups of flour. Add additional flour, if mixture is too sticky. Children enjoy playing and rolling it out when it reaches room temperature.

### Family Mission Project for January

#### Layettes

In refugee camps, hospitals, and villages around the world, gifts of layettes convey a warm welcome to newborns and their mothers.

Include the following items for a complete kit:

- Two lightweight cotton shirts (no Onesies)
- Two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- Two receiving blankets, medium weight cotton or flannel
- Four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- One jacket, sweater or sweatshirt; include a baby cap if no hood.
- Two pairs of socks
- One hand towel, dark in color preferred
- Two bath-size bar of gentle soap in original wrapping
- Two diaper pins

Gently used items can be substituted for new ones. Wrap items in one of the receiving blankets and secure with diaper pins.

#### Tips:

- Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Consider varying sizes of the clothing items included in the layette so it will continue to be useful as baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits or fleece. Preferred styles have buttons or ties down the front.
- Diapers can be made from flannel or even by recycling t-shirts. Go online to [lwr.org/beinvolved](http://lwr.org/beinvolved) and click on Layettes for a Diaper Tip Sheet for instructions.
