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MESSAGE FROM PASTOR DAVE NERDIG

It's painful to remember that I came to serve in this parish following the tragic loss of an amazing pastor and just before the well-deserved retirement of another kind and gifted pastor. I was honored to be asked to serve and did so without hesitation. Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer is a remarkable place and I am so happy to be a part of it. I have been accepted with warmth, forgiveness, and remarkable hospitality. Thank you for your grace.



Thank you for your ministries. Thank you for your love of the gospel. Thank you for the way you have proclaimed the gospel to me and this community with words and deeds.

Now I look with excitement to the next chapter in L.C.O.O.R's future. I have met Pastor Laura and Pastor Dan and I have not doubt at all that they will lead us into the future with heart and vision. I couldn't be more pleased. They are forthright and intuitive, energetic and devoted to serving Christ and I take great delight in telling you they love to laugh.

On January 31 I will end my ministry as Interim Associate Pastor. It has been a joy to serve here. Your staff is unmatched in its competence and compassion. They serve this Christ and this congregation unreservedly and care for each other in a way I have not experienced before. You have no idea how deeply this congregation benefits from their faithful service.

With my resignation my position among you will change. I will no longer be your pastor. I will not be available for weddings, baptism, funerals or counselling. I will not meet with the church council or staff. I will not be available for private consultation or critique of LCOOR's ministry. At my request, my LCOOR email will be deleted (that's sound almost ominous, doesn't it, but I've been assured it will not be painful). I will not disappear completely. I am already in communication with our new pastors and will occasionally provide pulpit supply or other incidental services at Pastor Laura and Dan's request. After I have some time to catch my breath, I may join some of the congregation's ministries. I say all this to you, as the politicians say, "out of an abundance of caution." I know that all of you will help me with this transition just as you so lovingly helped me with the transition into my role as Interim Associate Pastor.

I say it again, LCOOR is an amazing place. Linda and I are so happy to be a part of it. We are so pleased with the pastors God has provided for our faith community. We see nothing but grace in our future. We can't wait to see what God has in store!

January Mission of the Month

Nicaragua Partner Ministry & Nicaragua Youth Retreat

Pastor Soliette is our South Dakota Synod missionary to the Faith and Hope Lutheran Church of Nicaragua (Iglesia Luterana Fe y Esperanza – ILFE). She hosts travelers from South Dakota and assists them while they meet church members and look at various projects. She helps with the youth and health ministry of the church. The South Dakota Synod's costs for her salary and her travel within Nicaragua and visits to South Dakota are about \$9500 US per year.

Annual Lutheran Youth Camp

Early In January during the school vacation each year from 40 to 80 youth from the city of Managua and many other small cities and villages travel to Managua to take part in the Lutheran Youth Camp. The cost of transport, housing, and food averages about \$80 per participant. This camp is an excellent outreach to the young people. It is a chance to renew friendships, to learn about sports, health, furthering their career formation, and Bible study. Our synod budgets a goal of \$10,000 US each year to support the Iglesia Luterana Fe e Esperanza at this Camp.

LIFE WITH BLAKE

Wendy Kruger is a Teacher Aide at LCOOR's preschool. She and her husband DeLyle have three children. Their oldest Blake, suffered from a rare genetic disorder called TUBB2A. Blake was the oldest of only 8 children in the world with the disorder. TUBB2A causes brain malformations and significant developmental delays. Blake died of complications from the disease on December 13. At Blake's funeral, Wendy shared what it was for her family to share life with a child with developmental delays. Her words were eloquent and inspiring. They are a powerful message of how it is to live as both a care giver and a care receiver in a family with a child as wonderful as Blake. It is a testimony to the ministry that God gives to all his children, regardless of how their brains are wired. The complete message follows. I hope you are inspired by it as I am.

Thank you all for being here today.

When the words tumbled out of my mouth that I was going to speak today, I thought maybe it wasn't such a good idea, but then my husband said: You've been his voice all these years, maybe you need to do it one last time.

I can't tell you how much I miss him. There just aren't words.

When Blake was born, he was a very, very fussy baby....

And I would say it was about three or four months of age when we realized that things just weren't right. It was the trip to the cities where we saw a vision specialist and a neurologist that was the beginning of this journey in many ways. When the doctor tells you that you child has a developmental disorder - that there are many things that could be affected by the way his brain formed, besides just his vision, you have absolutely no idea how much your life is about to change.

It was also the first time we realized that Blake's life was going to revolve around music. Blake wasn't feeling well on that trip home and I happened to have a Winnie the Pooh tape cassette with us. The crying stopped when the music started and we learned quickly that once the music stopped the crying started again. We listened to that tape cassette the whole way home from the cities and just like that music became the center of his world. There was Elmo and Barney, Dora and the Wiggles and forever the constant was Signing Time and the Little Einsteins.

Blake's life, our lives, were filled with therapies and doctor's appointments. IEP meetings and constantly people trying to teach him things. And to be completely honest, Blake didn't care too much for it. He learned as a toddler to try a little (show some effort) and then hug his therapist and see if his love could get him out of the work.

When he was young, he didn't sleep and he didn't sit. Life was about continual motion.

Care for Blake was a constant thing - trouble wasn't far behind if you simply blinked. He could be out the door in a flash. He was like my little shadow always there. Slipping his hand in mine and convincing me we needed to walk together. Together we took many steps.

Until now, one of the hardest decisions we ever faced was letting him go to LifeScape. I felt like letting him go meant that I had failed him somehow that I wasn't doing enough to help him. And along the way we got the courage to just try and look what happened when I finally got the courage to share him with the world. LifeScape gave Blake two families, one at school and one at home. They embraced Blake for Blake and they helped care for him and helped him grow and flourish in an environment where it was okay to be who he was. I will be forever grateful for that love and care.

We all talk of his smile. He was the light in a room. And it is something I will carry with me forever. There was just something pure and innocent about it. Oh, what a smile.

But that smile, it hid the struggles he faced every day. He couldn't communicate like you and I. He didn't understand things and couldn't learn like his peers. He had seizures. Even being able to go to the bathroom was an issue. As life went along, he lost his ability to eat and swallow correctly. And then he started to battle pneumonia. What we don't talk about too much are the struggles. But the struggles and the hardship were very real. We focused on that smile instead and we took his lead and kept moving forward day after day.

He didn't trust easy. He would test you and see if you were really up for the job of his care. He saved his smile for those he loved the most. And when you were in, he'd tilt his head and spin with a grin.

Blake loved music and you would see an iPad in his hand constantly. Oh, we tried, every good teacher would want to explore and see what he could do without that iPad in his hand, but let me tell you - that is where you'd meet his stubbornness. He just wasn't having life without music. I'd like to believe that is a gift he shared with his brother and it will live on in the music Wyatt creates.

He loved his rides, his time in the car, the pickup or the ranger. He learned quickly who had the ability to drive and who would take him. It was his father's favorite job and they spent many hours riding together.

He loved to hide behind the trees and play peek a boo. Abby would help me chase him all around the yard. He loved his swings in the yard - the higher the better as long as he felt secure. He loved to wander - he couldn't slow down. And he loved the cause and effect of the light switches. As soon as the seasons changed it was dark in our house.

Blake had a sense of humor that came from both of his parents. He'd Facetime me when it was too loud in his room just to complain about his roommate or turn the camera on his staff who were dancing away as I sang to him. When he saw you, he'd run but stop and turn his head and smile so you couldn't see.

He was the center of our circle - tethering us all together. Life revolved around Blake and what he needed. He taught us to be better people, more kind and caring and have more empathy.

Blake taught us a lot about patience. You needed an abundant amount of patience to be Blake's caregiver. He was busy - and there were moment's I said, "Blake could you just sit still for one minute."

He taught us about compassion and acceptance. Not everyone is alike and has the same abilities but he showed us to embrace our differences and love one another no matter what.

As a parent, you think that you need to show and teach your children about the world. But with Blake, he taught me. He taught me to persevere - to keep fighting. He reminded me to slow down and enjoy the little things in life. He constantly kept me grounded. Take it easy mom, enjoy a song. Let's spin together.

And he taught me the value of the people in your lives. Why wouldn't you want to spend your days surrounded by the people you enjoy?

He faced so many obstacles, yet he made the world a better place. I truly believe God's light shined through Blake. Being his mother made me the person I am today. He was so much a part of who I am.

Fly high sweet boy, we love you.

DISH TO PASS

If ever there is a perfect time for an "epiphany," January is it! More specifically, January 6. While other places around the world put far more emphasis on Epiphany celebrations, I would invite you to create your own Epiphany traditions.

As a child, our family tradition was always to leave our Christmas tree up until January 6th. While we didn't actually celebrate "The 12 Days of Christmas" during this period, we kept things festive and celebrated my grandfather's birthday on January 6.



As a grown up, one of my favorite Epiphany traditions was held for many years by our Lutheran church family in Rapid City. Because the church was located just outside the city limits, we were able to have a bonfire on January 6th. All were invited to bring their Christmas trees – and we sang carols and enjoyed each other's company around the fire. Afterwards, we would go inside for warm beverages and home-baked goodies!

While reading a little more about Epiphany, I discovered that in "days of old" January 6 was the traditional Christmas gift-giving day, because this was the day that the Baby Jesus received his gifts from the Magi. While I'm not suggesting that we replace Christmas gifts on December 25, I'm thinking that adding an Epiphany gift to our lives sounds like a wonderful idea!

My other "epiphany" is that it will be perfectly acceptable to continue enjoying Christmas music throughout the 12 Days of Christmas. (In fact, I may just do that until the leaves are finally back on the trees!) Here's one of my favorites! Wont' you sing along?

Would be delicious served at an Epiphany bonfire!

8 OZ. CREAM CHEESE

2-1/4 c. FLOUR

1 C. MARGARINE

1-1/2 TSP. BAKING POWDER

1-1/2 c. sugar

½ C. MARASCHINO CHERRIES, CHOPPED

1-1/2 TSP. VANILLA

½ C. PECANS, CHOPPED

4 EGGS



Blend cream cheese, margarine, sugar and vanilla. Add eggs, one at a time. Add 2 cups of flour and mix well. Combine $\frac{1}{4}$ cup flour with cherries and nuts. Fold into the batter. Pour into lightly greased bundt pan or several small bread pans. Bake at 325 for 1 hour and 20 minutes. (Less time for bread pans.) Cool 5 minutes. Remove from pan and glaze with 1–1/2 cups powdered sugar and 2 Tbls. Milk or 1 Tbls. cherry juice.
