LENT Q & A

PASTOR DAN & PASTOR LAURA

"What is Lent anyway?" This is a question asked by a Sunday School student last week. Now everyone will benefit by receiving the answer to this question in writing.

Lent is the 40-day season of the church year that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends during Holy Week. During this time, the focus of worship is on the ministry, suffering and death of Jesus Christ. We can think of lent as the "springtime" in the church year. Out of the cold and darkness of sin's winter emerges the church- us- reborn in our Lord's Easter resurrection.

Why do we need Lent? Lent calls us to take time out and look back on the impact of our baptism on our lives. How are we doing, we who have died to sin and come alive to new life in Christ? In repentance we ask our Lord to clear out hearts and lives of sin's self-centeredness. We recall how God in his mercy sent his sinless Son, Jesus, to take our sins upon himself and receive sin's punishment by dying on the cross for us so that we might be forgiven.

What does Ash Wednesday mean? Christians often receive a cross of ashes on the forehead on the first day of Lent and are reminded, "You are dust and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 3:19). Ashes are often associated in the Bible with sorrow over sins. Ash Wednesday is February 22.

Why 40 Days? The Bible says Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness preparing for his formal ministry (Mark 1:13). So, Lent's 40 days signify that this is a time when we are preparing our hearts to remember Jesus' death for our salvation.

Why do people give up different things for Lent? The practice of denying ourselves something during Lent is a way for us to better understand the sacrifice Christ made for us, and it can free up time and resources which we can use for worship, prayer, study, meditation and/or charitable giving. This is considered an optional practice in the Lutheran tradition.

What is Holy Week? Holy week is the 7-day period at the end of Lent which is the culmination of the entire season. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday recount Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, his Last Supper with his disciples, and his Passion, death and burial before the joy of Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

So, what is Lent? In short, it's a time for us to slow down, reflect and prepare for the events of Holy Week and Easter. That's a huge order but you are not expected to do this alone. Journey with us as we all do our best. We encourage you to pick up a devotion book, use the new "Taking Faith Home" insert or join us for worship:

Wednesdays at 6:30- Worship theme is "Cross Purposes."

Sundays at 8:30 or 10:30- Worship theme is "Unfinished: Discovering God's Call in the Not Yet."


As we look forward further into spring, our like-mindedness to educate our kiddos becomes a goal. May your March come in like lamb and leave like a lamb, wind and weather permitting!

Installation Sunday with Renee Splichal Larson



Lent has arrived. And each year we ponder: Should we "give something up" for Lent? Should we "add something meaningful" for Lent? Should we "donate something from our excess belongings" each day of Lent?

If you've decided to do any of these things, I admire you. I appreciate your spiritual focus during these 40 days. Maybe you'd like to join me in trying something new – "being creatively thankful" during Lent. What does this look like? It means flipping any situations that tend to irritate us into things we can appreciate.



Here's a few examples:

- Be thankful for the sink full of dirty dishes, because it means we have food to eat.
- Instead of being upset that kids are making noise during worship, be grateful there are families worshipping together!
- For our huge heating bill, give thanks because it means we stayed warm.
- For the parking spot I find at the far end of the parking lot, because it means I am capable of walking.
- For terrible drivers, because it means that I have a car of my own to take me where I need to go.

A friend recently told me that whenever she encounters something frustrating during her day, she uses that energy toward creating a positive moment in someone else's life. For example, if someone treats one of her employees poorly, she reaches out with a "thank you" text or an "I appreciate you" phone call to make someone else's day a little brighter. I love this!

Each new day gives us many opportunities to be "creatively thankful." I look forward to hearing about your Lenten moments.
