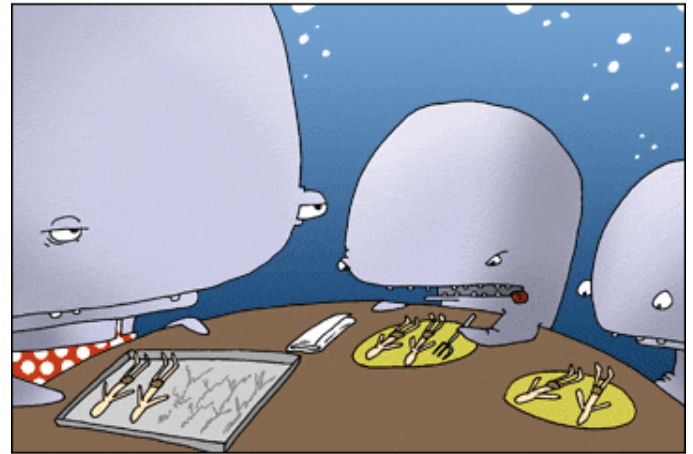
### Early sibling rivalry

**Middle School Merge/Route 56...** Will resume in September. Dates and activities will appear in the September newsletter.

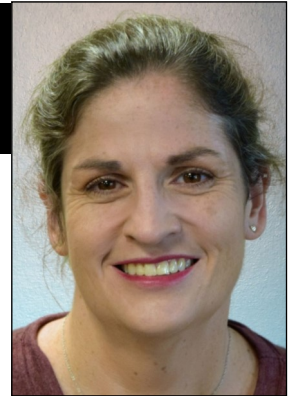

### Mission Project: School Kits

#### We need your help to make LWR School Kits

Education is one of the strongest tools a community has for breaking the cycle of poverty. Ensuring that girls attend school, especially in places where their access is deprioritized, has even stronger results. Lutheran World Relief School Kits contain essential supplies to help children — and in some cases, adults — continue learning in the face of serious obstacles. That learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

School Bags are available at the Welcome Center and Lake Coffee. Thank you for your support.

#### INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT

- FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper
- ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ONE pencil sharpener
- ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; se-



cure together with a rubber band

- FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ONE 2 ½-inch eraser
- ONE sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14-x-17 inch with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks) Available at the Welcome Center and Lake Coffee Table.

**HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE:** Place ruler between notebooks. Place all items neatly into the bag and draw the drawstring together.

## Dish to Pass

**T**his week I'm living in a state of anticipation -- and here's the reason! I dropped two rolls of film off to be developed! And, I have to wait at least a week to see the results.

Since we've all lived in a digital age for quite some time now, you might be wondering why I'm shooting actual film.

My Nikon SLR has been in a camera bag in my storage for more years than I care to admit. Recently, however, I came across a roll of "brand new" (undeveloped) film. After experiencing a minor "false start" on loading the film, I was ready to take some photos.

I took the vintage camera along on a recent camping trip to Pelican Lake. It's amazing how much more discerning you become when you know the film is limited to just 12 photos. (Plus, something resembling dollar signs seemed to pop up in my mind every time I was ready to take a photo.)

One particularly memorable experience happened while I was shooting a photo of a group of great-nieces and nephews at the campground. Their first question after I took their photo was, "Can we see it?" Imagine how puzzled they were to hear that we had to wait at least a week to see if the photo even turned out!

While I can hardly wait to see how this roll develops, my anticipation for the second roll is even greater. You see, it was shot many years ago -- but was never developed!

My current film experiment reminds me of how we sometimes treat our faith. There are times we are so excited and passionate that we can't wait to share our faith with others. Sometimes we put our faith away, intending to come back to it later. Other times, we may feel we've started something terrific, but we must wait to see how it develops. Fortunately, for us, faith is resilient.

No matter how those rolls of film turn out, chances are that my cell phone camera will continue to be my "go-to" when photo opportunities pop up! After all, we live in an age of instant sharing. My prayer is that our faith will continue to be as easily and instantly shared.

This month's recipe has a fantastic name -- Triple Whammy Cake! It was featured in a cookbook I picked up in Northern Minnesota this summer. Enjoy!



### Triple Whammy Cake

- 1 pkg (2-layer size) regular chocolate cake mix (no pudding added)
- 1 pkg (4-serving size) instant chocolate pudding mix
- 2 eggs
- 1-3/4 cup milk
- 1 pkg (12 oz.) chocolate chips

Combine cake mix, pudding mix, eggs and milk. Beat by hand (or with mixer) for 2 minutes. Stir in chocolate chips. Pour into greased Bundt pan. Bake in 350-degree oven for 50 to 55 minutes. Cool for 15 minutes in pan before turning onto cake plate. Serve plain or dust with powdered sugar. (Or top with chocolate frosting to make a quadruple whammy.)

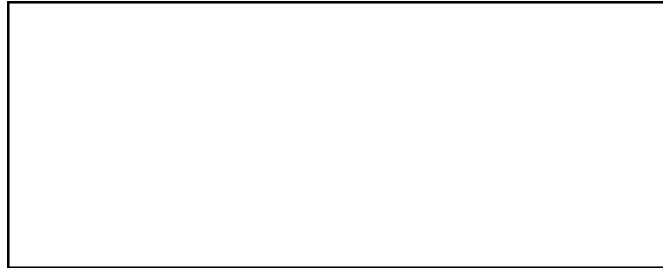
