MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTORS

“The Christian shoemaker does his or her duty not by putting little crosses on the shoes, but by making good shoes because God is interested in good craftsmanship.” Martin Luther

This statement made by Martin Luther hundreds of years ago gets to the heart of his understanding of vocation. Vocation is the church's word for the work that we all do in the world and the ways that God uses us to be his hands and feet to share God's love through that work. God can – and does – use each of us to make this world a little better.

In Martin Luther's medieval world, there were various orders of – and values assigned to – labor. Those who worked for the church – nuns, monks, priests – were viewed as doing “better” or more spiritual work. Luther, however, believed that God calls **all** Christians. Each one of us can care for the world God loves and for this reason, all labor done with care and with a regard for the neighbor is of equal value and pleasing to God.

In fact, the word vocation stems from the root – vocation – or “calling.” As Lutherans, we believe that we are all called by God to care for our neighbor and world, and anything we do toward that end – whether it is for pay or volunteer, prestigious or unnoticed, in a “helping profession” or not – is holy work.

Thank you for your holy work, right where you are.

September Mission of the Month- St. Dysmas

We all stumble and fall at times in life. It is easy for those decisions and actions to become the definition of our lives, and may make us feel unlovable and unforgivable. However, God disagrees...

God created, chose, and loves you and includes you in his beloved family. At St. Dysmas, guided by the Holy Spirit and through the promises given in Jesus Christ, they welcome all to this family. Proclaiming God's mercy and grace to all. This is God's mission for us to the people we serve behind bars.

We are called to teach and preach Jesus Christ as the light in darkness, to trust in God's word of forgiveness, and to praise God in all that we do.

St. Dysmas, two congregations of the ELCA (Evangelical Church in America) located behind the walls of the South Dakota State Penitentiary in Sioux Falls and Mike Durfee State Prison in Springfield. They also support Sunday evening worship at the Yankton Minimum Unit in Yankton.

Jesus said, "for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick, and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me." Matthew 25:35-36

St. Dysmas Lutheran Church's ministry reaches outside of the walls by inviting people in congregations to support the ministry happening inside the walls by showing the men concretely that they are not forgotten by worshipping with them in the prison.

The ministry of St. Dysmas also extends outside of the walls through our St. Dysmas Reentry program. Congregations have been invited to form Reentry Teams that walk with a man for the first year after their release, mentoring them, being a listening ear, and helping them to reestablish themselves in their community. This truly is living out what Jesus said in Matthew 25.

BIBLE PRINCIPLES

Applying Bible Principles

If you read annual reports from publicly held companies or banks, you will frequently see the word “fiduciary.” Fiduciary is used as an adjective to describe something which is held in trust. It is also used as a noun to describe the one who is a trustee who must account for that which is held in trust.

For example, a bank president has a fiduciary responsibility to stockholders in the bank and to depositors who place their money in the bank. A company treasurer has a fiduciary responsibility to the owners of the company. A payroll clerk has a fiduciary responsibility to pay people what they have earned.

You may never have considered yourself a fiduciary, and you may never have acted officially in a fiduciary capacity, but in reality, you are a fiduciary. All of us are. That applies both to Christians and to those who are not part of God’s family through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We who are Christians will stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ. There, we will not be judged for salvation, since the penalty and judgment for sin was settled once and for all on the cross of Calvary when the Lord Jesus paid the price for our sin. Instead, when we stand before Christ, we will give an account of how we have used what God has entrusted to us.

Just as a bank president must account to stockholders and depositors on how their funds are used, we must account to Christ for how we have used what God has entrusted to us. Since everything we have rightfully belongs to Him, we will need to report on how we have managed His assets!

As you consider how you have used what God has entrusted to your care and keeping during the past few months, what kind of job have you done? And more importantly, as a “fiduciary” of what God has placed in your hands, will you stand before Him with joy, eager to report on your giving and management of His assets?

It's Road Ditch Time

Our two miles of road ditch are in need of attention this fall. It's a simple hour out of your day or evening to make our two miles of Highway 20 look fantastic! Our miles begin on Highway 20 west to 449th. From there we have a sign on that NW corner, and our section goes for two miles to the next sign which is on the SW corner. As a point of reference, this is on Highway 20 west past the lake, past the water tower, past the curves to 449th and the LCOOR sign.

We have divided the miles into six(6) sections to make it easy for a family to pick up trash in an hour or less.

Section 1: 449th South side of Highway 20. to the white tire on the fence—south side of the highway.

Section 2: South side of Highway 20 from the white tire to Memorial Park Road (448th Ave)

Section 3: South side of Highway 20, from 448 Ave. (Memorial Park Road) to the LCOOR sign.

Section 4: North side of Highway 20 from the LCOOR sign on 449th to the white tire.

Section 5: Highway 20 North side of the road from the white tire to 448th (Memorial Park Road)

Section 6: North side of Highway 20 from 448th Ave West to the LCOOR sign.

This is a fun family project and you can do it when it is best for you!

Packets with bags and gloves are available at the church office—or call the office and arrangements can be made to deliver the directions and bags. Also ask at the Welcome Center if you attend in person. Take the orange bags home with you and dispose of in your blue containers.

Many thanks for keeping our environment clean. Let's get this done by October 1.
