MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTORS

John 3:16 “For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.”

We live in a world of constant change. Change is inevitable, even in the church. Over the past four months, we have heard your concerns. We have heard feedback about the changes of the announcement page, the moving of the welcome center, and the addition of Bibles in the sanctuary to name a few. We know these changes are adjustments. We also know that this anxiety and apprehension can be paralyzing, but it doesn't need to hold us back.

In the well-known text from John 3:16, Jesus tells Nicodemus that he must be “born of the spirit.” Here's the key: we are not bound by the same concerns of those who live according to the flesh because our future and fate are sealed by God's tremendous love. “Do not be astonished,” Jesus says to Nicodemus, “that I said to you, ‘You must be born from above.’ The wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.”

The Spirit blows where it will. This message gives us tremendous freedom when we think about how best to respond to the challenges and opportunities whether they are in the church or our personal lives.

We know that part of what is so anxiety-provoking about this time is that it feels like there is no road map. Like this is change with no plan.

Despite this, Jesus promises that the Spirit accompanies and empowers us to face a future that we may feel is uncertain but has been secured by the death and resurrection of Jesus. From this perspective, *the anxiety that many of us feel – there is no roadmap! – can be transformed into excitement – there is no roadmap!* This means that we are free – we don't have to do things the way they've always been done.

We can experiment, risk, fail, learn, and grow in ways we'd never imagined because the Spirit of Christ will blow us in directions we hadn't imagined.

God intends good for us, both here in our life together and ultimately in our eternal life with God. For this reason, whatever setbacks or even failures we may experience are always temporary, because God has promised to redeem the world in and through Jesus. Which again, means we are free to try. We are free to experiment and struggle and succeed and fail and live and love and die...all knowing that in Christ God has already worked to redeem the whole world. In other words, redemption is God's responsibility, not ours. Our job is to strive to identify and share where we see hints of that redemption already.

It is true, LCOOR has been through a lot of changes. It is true that we do face some challenges. It is also true that there are opportunities in our future. Whether we grow or shrink, flourish or struggle; whether the bulletin is formatted to your liking, or the church furniture has been moved, this is all challenge and opportunity bundled into one. We appreciate your feedback but ask that you bring it to us and the staff in a non-confrontational, kind way. We are all doing our best.

Here's the key: we are free to try, to live in love and kindness, to offer support and grace.

Remember that God loves this whole world – including us and our little corner of it – and has promised that whatever may come, we all have God's promise of redemption in and through Christ Jesus our Lord. That is the big picture. That message will never change.

Applying Bible Principles

There are some wonderful principles in the Old Testament which apply to present-day Christians. One of these is in Deuteronomy 8:10-18. Stated in contemporary language, it says, "When you have eaten and are full, when your cars, houses and bank accounts multiply, don't forget where it came from: Remember the Lord your God."

In truth, all that we have comes from God. He determines what we will receive, whether it be money, gold, silver, houses, land, bank accounts, stocks, bonds, etc. It all belongs to Him in the first place, and He entrusts it to us. According to David's prayer in 1 Chronicles 29, riches, honor, power, and wealth all come from God.

That's why there is no such thing as a self-made man or woman. Oh, we have to do our part. God's plan is not that we just sit around praying and reading the Bible all day long so that what we need to survive will miraculously drop into our hands. We're not just to pray for "our daily bread," but we're also to get up each day and work for it! That's why the Apostle Paul stated clearly, "Anyone unwilling to work should not eat" (2 Thes. 3:10). But in reality, the amount of money and wealth which we receive is determined by God. According to His divine will and knowledge, He entrusts to each of us the amounts which He knows will be best for us.

What should be our reaction to our financial state? Some might pray, "Dear Lord, you must have made a mistake concerning me and my finances. Please give me more money." Others might try to circumvent God's design for their lives by trying to win the lottery or to obtain large sums of money through some other means. Mature Christians, however, will realize God's infinite wisdom far surpasses their limited perspective. They will accept with a thankful spirit what God has entrusted to them and seek to honor God by their living and by their giving.

JEWISH APPLE CAKE

3 C. FLOUR	3 TSP. BAKING POWDER
2 C. SUGAR	1 TSP. SALT
1 C. SALAD OIL	3 LG. APPLES, PEELED AND SLICED
4 EGGS	<u>SUGAR MIXTURE:</u>
½ C ORANGE JUICE	½ C. SUGAR
2-1/2 TSP. VANILLA	1 TSP. CINNAMON



PLACE FIRST 8 INGREDIENTS INTO BOWL IN ORDER GIVEN. BEAT UNTIL SMOOTH. PLACE HALF OF BATTER INTO GREASED AND FLOURED TUBE PAN. ARRANGE APPLE SLICES ON TOP OF BATTER. STIR TOGETHER SUGAR MIXTURE AND SPRINKLE HALF OF IT ON BATTER. REPEAT BY ADDING OTHER HALF OF BATTER, APPLE SLICES AND SUGAR MIXTURE. BAKE AT 325 FOR 1-1/2 HOURS. SERVES 16.
