DEVOTIONS



Read: Luke 10:1-11, 16-20.

Throughout the Gospel of Luke, there is a lot of eating and drinking. There is a simplicity, even an innocence, about how Jesus sends out the seventy to form faithful and caring communities. The beauty of the life Jesus brings is in shared hospitality. The kingdom of God is as near as daily fellowship through eating and drinking. Our life together gathered around meals is central to Jesus' work. This includes our meals together each day and when we receive the Lord's Supper. God's kingdom is near and experienced through people sharing God's peace with one another and caring for one another through fellowship while enjoying a meal together. Sitting together at a table is a powerful way to form community, to hear personal stories, and to care for the hurts and celebrate the joys in our lives. Amid being together, Jesus wants us to pray for one another and bring healing and peace to our lives and to our world.

Discuss: What stories have you heard, or joys have you celebrated around a meal? How has God's presence been felt during that time together?

Pray: Nurturing God, we thank you for bringing us together into communities of care that feed, heal, and celebrate life in your kingdom through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

SERVICE



Jesus calls us to serve our neighbor in love. Based on the Daily Bible Readings and theme for this week, have a meal with someone and share joys and sorrows together.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS



Jesus sent out seventy of his followers to go ahead of him. He told them that upon entering a house they were to say, "Peace to this house" (Luke 10:5).
