Together we thank you for all that you do and all that you give to the mission of Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer. You make a difference!

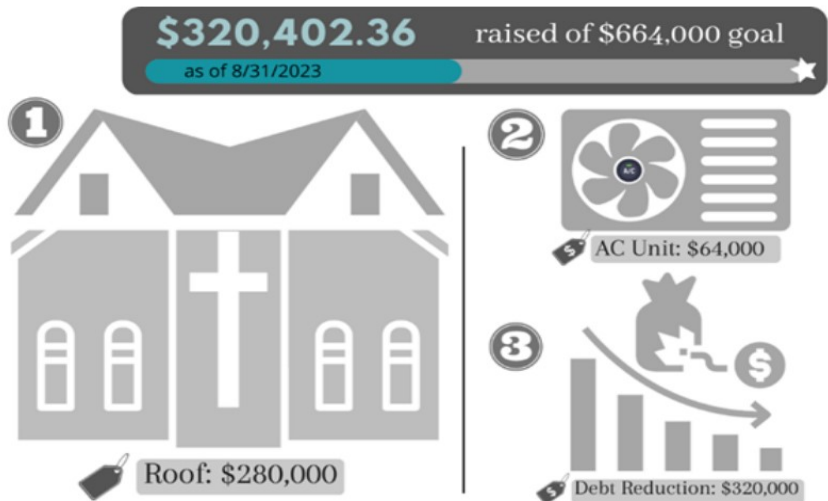

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Cameroon (ELCC), a member of the [Lutheran World Federation](#), is a fast-growing church with 215,000 members in 1,350 congregations. The ELCC is served by 168 pastors, 375 evangelists, and 288 catechists among 27 ethnic groups. Led by a national bishop and ten regional bishops, one for each of the 10 Episcopal regions, the ELCC has its headquarters in Ngaoundere. Besides the LWF, the ELCC is a member of the Eglise évangélique luthérienne au Cameroun (Church and Evangelical Lutherans of Cameroon), the Lutheran Communion in Western Africa (LUCWA), and the Joint Christian Ministry in West Africa (JCMWA). The ELCC’s program ministries include seminary education, Bible schools, primary and secondary education, health care, rural development, women’s and youth ministries, Bible translation and literacy, and a communication studio. Those funds, combined with the generosity of donors, ensure LWR has the resources needed to move these items around the world. You can help!

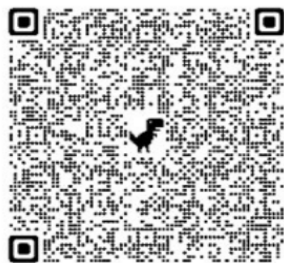

BIBLE PRINCIPLES

Applying Bible Principles

A wise person once observed, “Half of any task is having the right tool, and the other half is knowing what to do with it.” Although we don’t often consider it as such, money is a tool which God uses in our lives as a means of spiritual growth.

You see, money is not an end in and of itself. It is a means to an end. And in God’s hands, one of its primary “ends” is to instruct us and to help us grow spiritually. God especially wants us to avoid our natural tendency which is a bend toward selfishness, greed, and hoarding. That’s why the Lord Jesus said, “Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one’s life does not consist in the abundance of possessions” (Luke 12:15).

Well, if an individual’s life does not consist in having a lot of possessions, in what does it consist? Jesus provided an insightful answer to that question in Matthew 6:20-21, where He said, “. . . store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.”

Now, according to Jesus’ teaching in the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25), there is nothing wrong with saving. There is nothing wrong with investing or earning interest on investments. There is nothing wrong with being a wise steward by planning for the future. In fact, Jesus taught that those who do so are to be commended. But our primary emphasis as God’s children is to make our investments in the “Bank of Heaven.” When we do that, our investments are secure. They are not affected by inflation, by theft, by wear and tear, or anything of the kind.

There is only one way to make deposits in this special “bank”: By giving to the Lord’s work. Although the money is used here, it is credited to your eternal account. Each time you give your tithes and offerings at Lutheran Church of Our Redeemer, you are giving to the Lord by investing for eternity. You are storing up “treasures in heaven” that will glorify God forever.

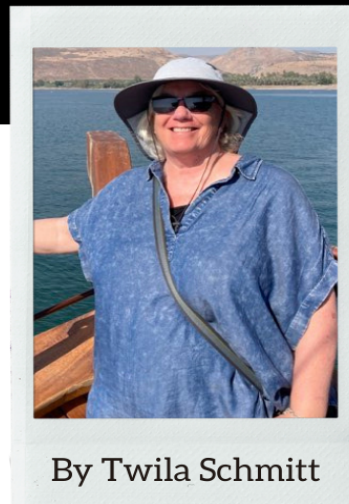

DISH TO PASS

"Ain't it funny, how time slips away?" How many of us are old enough to remember this this song? It popped into my mind this week while I was preparing to lead a session of our bible study on the "Footsteps of the Savior." This Max Lucado series features video footage of many sites in the Holy Land. While I was thinking about how to include some insights from our recent pilgrimage to the Holy Land, it occurred to me that THREE MONTHS have already passed since we returned home! In that relatively short amount of time, some of the day-to-day details have slipped away...but the life-changing memories of the trip will always be with me.



As it turns out, I only shared one photo during that bible study. But it was a powerful one. The detailed mural in my photo depicted the very moment that the woman in Capernaum touched Jesus's robe. Even though Jesus was surrounded by people, he somehow knew instantly that someone had reached out and touched the hem of his garment. And she knew instantly that she had been healed from a life-long disease. (Mark 5:21-43)

I'm finding so many "connecting" stories since that trip. About the time we returned home, I was excited to see that *Gather* magazine was featuring a bible study on "Holy Places." In fact, the cover has a beautiful photo of Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in Jerusalem, where we had worshiped just weeks before. As Pastor Laura led the September study, she shared some of her personal experience in the Holy Land with both the Priscilla and Martha Circles. And I was again reminded of the powerful sights and lessons we learned.

I hope you'll keep your eyes open this month for further opportunities to hear from Pastor Dan, Pastor Laura, Bev Splinter, Annette Gugel and myself about our Holy Land pilgrimage. Bev's been working on a slideshow – and we're all trying to figure out how to condense two weeks of experiences into a reasonably short presentation. As our tour guide often said, "Come and See." Amen.

ANOTHER HIGHLIGHT OF MARTHA CIRCLE'S GATHERING THIS MONTH WAS LANA RONNING'S "FRESH APPLE CAKE!" SHE PROMISED TO SHARE THE RECIPE – AND SHE DID!

FRESH APPLE CAKE

4-1/2 C. PEELED & CHOPPED RAW APPLES	1 TSP. BAKING SODA
LEMON JUICE	1 TSP. BAKING POWDER
1-1/2 C. SALAD OIL	2 TSP. VANILLA
2 C. SUGAR	1-1/2 C. PECANS, CHOPPED
2 LARGE EGGS	1 TSP. SALT
2-1/2 C. FLOUR	

PREPARE APPLES, PUT A LITTLE LEMON JUICE OVER THEM. SET THEM ASIDE AND COVER. ADD SUGAR AND EGGS TO OIL. MIX WELL AT LOW SPEED UNTIL CREAMY AND SMOOTH. SIFT FLOUR AND MEASURE. SIFT AGAIN WITH SALT, SODA AND BAKING POWDER. ADD FLOUR MIXTURE TO CREAMED MIXTURE A LITTLE AT A TIME. FOLD IN WELL AFTER EACH ADDITION. ADD VANILLA. WHEN BATTER IS STIFF, REMOVE BEATERS AND FINISH MIXING BY HAND. FOLD IN APPLES AND NUTS. BAKE IN 9X13 PAN FOR 55 TO 60 MINUTES AT 350 DEGREES.

FROSTING:

1 STICK BUTTER	1/8 TSP. SALT	SMALL AMOUNT POWDERED SUGAR
2 TBLS. MILK	1 C. BROWN SUGAR	

COMBINE BUTTER, SALT, MILK AND BROWN SUGAR IN SAUCEPAN. HEAT THS STIR UNTIL SMOOTH AND SUGAR IS DISSOLVED. REMOVE FROM HEAT. ADD POWDERED SUGAR AND CONTINUE STIRRING UNTIL SPREADING CONSISTENCY.

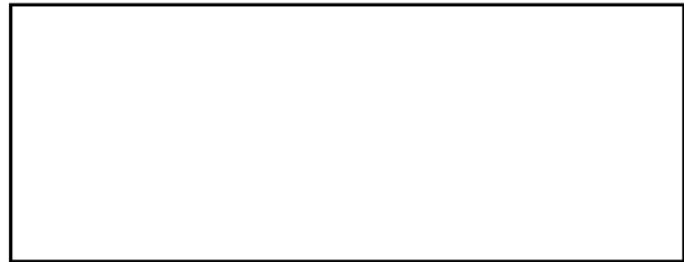
