## MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTORS

It's November and it's time for giving thanks and Thanksgiving.
An article published in the 1958 magazine called The Prairie Overcoming made me pause recently. "It has often been pointed out that thinking precedes thanking. When we are presented with a gift, it is because we think of its significance and meaning that we are led to express our appreciation."

Thinking precedes thanking; If this is true, then we can use this month of thanking to also spend some time thinking. Together, we can think about where to give thanks. When my boys were little, the following poem was posted inside the cupboard door, near the kitchen sink.

"Thank God for dirty dishes, they have a tale to tell; While others may go hungry, we've eaten very well. With home, health, and happiness I shouldn't want to fuss, By the stack of evidence, God's been very good to us!" (author unknown)


What are the thoughts that lead to thanks for you? As this poem suggests, we can begin with thoughts of God. Think of all God is-the provider of all good gifts, gracious, merciful, forgiving of our sins who sent us Jesus and empowers us by his Holy Spirit. God is the giver of all blessings, material and spiritual. What are you thankful for? Think of those things in life that give you joy. Maybe it's a sunrise, the love of family, or healing of some kind in body, mind, or spirit. Thank God for those things.

As the article from "The Prairie Overcomer" continued, "The cares and riches and pleasures of this life choke the plant of gratitude, and our lives become unfruitful... Thanksgiving is thus really the product of careful cultivation. It is the fruit of a deliberate resolve to think about God, ourselves, and our privileges and responsibilities. By giving thanks we make manifest the fact that our lives are not controlled by the imperious cares and concerns of this life. We give testimony to the fact that material things do not dictate the horizons of our soul."

As Psalm 105:1 says, "...O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his steadfast love endures forever." Thank the Lord for all his goodness today!

Fallout Shelter Ministries has operated as a non-profit since 2016.
"Our influences have afforded us the privilege to travail with victims of Human Trafficking, Domestic Violence, and Sexual Assault as well as Addiction Recovery and Trauma Recovery. Day to day we are able to have ministry opportunities with youth and others who do not attend any church or have no other example of Christ in their life. And week to week we travel to serve, preach. We gather as a home church, breaking bread \& diving into the Word of God."

The Noisy Can and Specially Marked Offering for Mission of the Month in November will help Fallout do outreach locally and around the world, including transporting those in need, teaching those at risk, protecting the vulnerable, feeding the hungry.


Total pledged and received dollars raised to date is $\$ 321,473.36$.

| $1 / 2 ~ C . ~ S H O R T E N I N G ~$ | 1 TSP. SODA |
| $1 / 2$ C. WHITE SUGAR | 1 TSP. CREAM OF TARTAR |
| $1 / 2$ C. BROWN SUGAR | 1 TSP. SALT |
| 1 EGG, UNBEATEN | $2-1 / 4$ C. FLOUR |



CREAM TOGETHER BUTTER, SHORTENING, WHITE SUGAR AND BROWN SUGAR. BEAT IN ONE EGG AND ADD VANILLA. Sift together flour, soda, cream of tartar and salt. Add to first mixture. Roll in small balls. Flatten slightly. Dip in cold water in small dish and dip in sugar in small dish. Bake at 350 for 13 TO 14 MINUTES. ENJOY!
