Call to Worship

As we move deeper into the season of Advent, focusing on our Lord's coming, we light the third candle—the candle of joy. This is the joy the angel spoke about to the shepherds as he said:

I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all people.

(The first two blue candles and one pink candle are lit.)

Though you have not seen Christ, you love him;

Even though we do not see him now, we believe in him and are filled with an inexpressible and glorious joy.

For you are receiving the goal of your faith,

The salvation of our souls.

So with all the joy of Christ's coming, we gather together.

Confession and Forgiveness

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We confess our sin. Lord, we come before you in prayer today, asking for forgiveness. We have not loved as we ought to love, we have not given as we ought to give, and we have fallen short of the mark of truly being your sons and daughters. We recognize our sins and in this moment of silence, we privately remember our shortcomings in love and life.

Silence for reflection.

God, our heavenly Father, hears the prayers of his children and answers those prayers. Our prayer for forgiveness is answered in the person of Jesus Christ, his Son, who died for our sin that we might have new life in him. To those who believe his Word of truth he gives power to be the people of God. Praise God for his gift of love to us. **Amen.**

First Reading Zephaniah 3:14-20

Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has taken away the judgments against you; he has cleared away your enemies. The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst; you shall never again fear evil. On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: "Fear not, O Zion; let not your hands grow weak. The Lord your God is in your midst, a mighty one who will save; he will rejoice over you with gladness; he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing. I will gather those of you who mourn for the festival, so that you will no longer suffer reproach. Behold, at that time I will deal with all your oppressors. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise and renown in all the earth. At that time I will bring you in, at the time when I gather you together; for I will make you renowned and praised among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes before your eyes," says the Lord. Nicene Creed
